Fall 2019 Course Syllabus

30 hours in classes and preparation

This quarter course series one is part of a three-part global series provided by [IMFAHE: International Mentoring Foundation for the Advancement of Higher Education](#) and its European Innovation Network. They are devoted to improving the educational development of students and young professionals through international mentorship and collaborations. Students and young researchers may choose to enroll in only one of the three courses and will receive credit for the quarter course in which they have enrolled. Students enrolling in all three quarter courses will receive credit for all three courses.

Course Description. The format of this course is an online lecture series consisting of a presentation led by an international expert that allow students and young researchers to actively participate and discuss the topic in detail as it applies to their career development. Young professionals and students today face a rapidly developing, global job market. To become a future strong job applicant, there are many skills in professional development, which an applicant must master. This course uses an online masterclass format to present key skills in professional development for participating students. In this quarter course, we will explore the steps of how to successfully get a job, how to build an effective CV and resume, how to write a strong cover letter, how to prepare for an interview, and how appropriately market your ability using networking tools such as LinkedIn. In each session, we will examine different aspects of professional development in preparing students and young professionals for the job market, specifically a job in the scientific field.

Learning Objectives. At the end of this course, participants will be able to

- Write a successful cover letter and CV/resume
- Effectively market themselves for a job (strong job pitch, building a strong 'brand', using LinkedIn)
- Have a good understanding of the interview process
- Develop skills required to successfully compete for a job

Attendance. As this is a participation based course, your attendance at all seven of the the masterclass online sessions is vital. - Watch the four recorded masterclasses and complete the questionnaire for these masterclasses and



- Complete the practical exercises. Students who do not fulfil these requirements will receive a grade of “fail”.

Practical exercises

- CV/resume and cover letter.** Based on the guidelines in this course, create your own CV or resume and write a cover letter for a potential job, you would be interested in applying for. Participants who are not currently looking for jobs should still chose a potential future job as practice for which to write a cover letter for. Share the cover letter and CV/resume with the course directors and then finalize your work by asking for feedback from your international mentor or a peer. You should email to IMFAHE your CV or resume as part of this course, in order to get the Quarter course diploma.
- Practice a mock interview.** Find a mock interview session, or practice the interview process with your peers, and international mentor (if you are part of IMP at IMFAHE). *N.B.: In order to get the Quarter course diploma you will need to email to IMFAHE a document listing 5 potential companies or hosting labs where you would like to work next, including the next information: Who are they? What do they do? What is the value that you will bring to the centre?*
- Write and practice your elevator pitch.** Write out what your elevator pitch would be and practice giving it to peers. *After finalizing it, you will need to email to IMFAHE your written elevator pitch in order to get the diploma.*
- Make an effective LinkedIn Profile.** Register for LinkedIn and use the tips offered to create a successful LinkedIn Profile. *After finalizing it, you will need to share with IMFAHE your LinkedIn profile link, in order to get your diploma.*
